Detailed information about Indiana and U.S. colleges and universities and programs of study enables investigation of education and training options. A set of interest, work values, skills, and reality checking assessments helps users to identify and explore life-style choices, occupations, and programs of study. Sorting tools enable identification of colleges, occupations, and scholarships by matching with personally selected criteria. A portfolio system provides users with the capability to store information, assessment results, sort lists, plans, and reflections. INCIS integrates Universal Encouragement Program assessments through its portfolio system, enabling students to create and save their guidance assessments in INCIS.
